

Ten tactics for promoting positive behaviour

1.	Make sure that children know what you want
	them to do. Be realistic about what you expect
	from them.

- 2. Make sure you have up to date information about children in your care.
- 3. Look for good behaviour and good playing.

 Remember to praise the behaviour rather than the child.
- 4. Make sure the child knows exactly what they are being praised for.
- 5. Try to praise quickly and consistently and praise children to others. Think carefully about the language you use when talking about behaviour.

- 6. Help children to make and keep a few simple, positive rules. Use positive language avoid don't.
- 7. Tackle changing one behaviour at a time try not to nag.
- 8. Help children to learn how to resolve conflicts.
- 9. Look closely at the wider environment: Does your practice seek to prevent unacceptable behaviour? Make sure that the environment you have created is arranged appropriately.
- 10. Build treats into your week as rewards for especially good behaviour.

Remember: changes take time. A consistent approach is essential.
