


## **Network Management Duty**

"It is the duty of a local traffic authority to manage their road network with a view to achieving, so far as may be reasonably practicable having regard to their other obligations, policies and objectives, the following objectives:

- (a) securing the expeditious movement of traffic on the authority's road network; and,
- (b) facilitating the expeditious movement of traffic on road networks for which another authority is the traffic authority."

Consider the needs of all road users, including utilities who need to access their services

Manage the road space for everyone

Identify current and future causes of congestion and disruption and plan to take action

Proactive coordination of works on the network

Facilitate expeditious movement of traffic with other affected authorities

### New Roads and Street Works Act 1991

### 1991 CHAPTER 22

An Act to amend the law relating to roads so as to enable new roads to be provided by new means; to make new provision with respect to street works and, in Scotland, road works; and for connected purposes. [27th June 1991]

NEW ROADS BY ENGLAND AND WALES

Concession agreements

- Concession agreements.
  - (1) In this Part a "concession agreement" means an agreement entered into by a highway authority under which a person (the "concessionaire"), in return for undertaking such obligations as may be specified as the agreement with respect to the design.

### Three key elements:

- 1. Notification for works
- 2. Streets subject to special controls
- 3. LHA coordination powers

Section 59 – duty of street authorities to coordinate all works in the highway

Section 60 – the duty of undertakers to cooperate in this process.

## Service Functions



## Statutory Undertakers

Organisations (utility companies) with statutory obligations to provide a supply or service, typically:

- 1. Gas
- 2. Water (clean and dirty)
- 3. Electricity
- 4. Telecommunications

Monitored by utility regulators, such as OFWAT (water), OFGEM (gas and electricity) and OFCOM (telecommunications).







## Streetworks

As defined in section 48(3) of NRSWA: street works means works executed in pursuance of a statutory right or a street works licence:

- (a) placing apparatus; or
- (b) inspecting, maintaining, adjusting, repairing, altering, etc. apparatus



## Roadworks

As defined in section 86(2) of NRSWA: works for road purposes means:

- a) works for the maintenance of the highway;
- b) any works under Part V of the Highways Act 1980



- c) works on traffic signs on or near the highway
- d) The construction of a crossing for vehicles

## Developer Works

Highways Act Section 278

Section 278 Agreement is a legally binding document between the Highway Authority and Developer

Ensures works are carried out to the Highway Authorities requirements



## **Coordination Process**

Information

Works promoter to provide accurate and timely information on what is proposed and when it is happening, or what is currently happening

**Analysis** 

LHA to analyse the information from the works promoter

Consideration

LHA needs to consider changes required to work to minimise disruption before agreement can be reached

Cooperation

All parties must cooperate to achieve minimum disruption






## Permit scheme



- Organisations book occupation instead of giving notice
- Conditions can be applied to control works before and during occupation
- Any variations to works will need to be requested and agreed
- Parity treatment for the Council's own highways works

### Permit Offences

Street Works Inspectors will carry out Permit Compliance Inspections;

The permit regulations create two new offences for statutory undertakers:-

- 1. Carrying out activities on the street without a permit, or in the case of immediate works not applying for a permit within two hours of the works starting (Regulation 19)
- 2. Carrying out activities on the street or highway in a way that contravenes the conditions attached to a permit, or the conditions that are applied to an immediate activity before a permit is issued for those activities (Regulation 20)

Working without a permit (Reg 19)	£500	£300
Working in breach of conditions (Reg 20)	£120	£80




FPNs (fixed penalty notices) are issued with respect to "noticing failures"

Regulation 19: £500 fee for working without a permit

Regulation 20: £120 fee for failing a permit inspection (e.g. no permit board)
