Care home visiting and government position for Leicester

As we reported in bulletin 89, Leicestershire's director of public health, Mike Sandys, yesterday provided a statement on the government's advice for Leicester.

Walk-up 'dose 1' vaccination clinics for workers from some City postcodes

A series of walk-up clinics for people who have not yet received their dose 1 COVID-19 vaccination have been set up between now and Sunday 6 June, with extended opening hours.
