Moderating Pupils Work

Primary schools: moderating pupils work is an important task for schools – it needs to be got right! LCC's Early Team provides staff training and it may be that governors can ask Heads whether training has occurred.

Training for Early Years practitioners in schools and pre-schools is now available to book for the spring term.

Heads will also have received a letter informing them if your school is being [externally] moderated or not. If it is, the report will be an excellent opportunity for schools to check their expectations around progress and attainment and as external validation for governing boards in their responsibility to monitor and evaluate

Hoax Text Messages

Please be aware that a parent of a Leicester primary school pupil this week received an SMS text message at 0630am from someone purporting to be a school nurse, reminding the parent of an impending appointment.

On investigation it is clear that that this was not a school nurse from Healthy Together. The school has been made aware that this SMS text message was not from Healthy Together and will ask parents and pupils to be vigilant over the coming days.

The advice is:

- School Nurses do not send text messages as their first contact with parents.
- If you receive a text message requesting information about your child from anyone purporting to be a School Nurse, please DO NOT engage.

Teachers set for biggest sustained pay increase since 2005

Proposals put forward for teacher starting salaries to rise to £26,000 this September, building towards £30,000 by September 2022.

Under proposals submitted today (21 January) to the independent School Teachers' Review Body (STRB), the Education Secretary Gavin Williamson has outlined plans to increase starting salaries to at least £26,000 in September 2020, with those in outer and inner London to rise to £30,000 and £32,000 respectively.
